Victoria Woodward opened the meeting with introductions at 9:30 a.m. **Motion** to approve April 3, 2009 meeting minutes - **approved**.

**News from MDE** – Ken Pensyl (*attachment*)

- **Stimulus Funding Update**
  - Workshop held on April 27, 2009
    - About 114 people attended
    - Information was given on funding process for potential grant/loan recipients
    - MDE is working closely with those that were selected
    - Projects to be ready for approval of plans and specification by July 30, 2009
    - Future deadlines are to open bid document by September 30, 2009
    - Issue notice to proceed construction by December 31, 2009
    - Letters have been sent to all applicants on Stimulus Priority List that have not been selected for funding.
  
- **Acid Mine Drainage (AMD) Conference**
  - Neil Jacobs spoke on plans for upcoming Acid Mine Drainage conference
  - Date is as yet undetermined
  
- **Crellin Borehold Lime Doser Project**
  - Latest lime doser project going on between Maryland and West Virginia
  - AMD site is on West Virginia side but on our border
  - Drainage is having a major impact on water quality of Laurel Run, Snowy Creek and Youghiogheny River in Maryland
  - West Virginia will provide all operation and maintenance funding while MDE's Bureau of Mines will perform all operation and maintenance activities.
  - Public meeting was held on March 25, 2009 to inform stakeholders and local residents of the startup of the lime doser which will likely turn stream a milky white.
  - Start up is expected in the next few weeks

- **Maryland Ground Water Symposium**
  - Water Supply Program is seeking presenters for this year's Symposium
  - Usually attracts about 400 ground water professionals from around the State

- **MDE Septics Upgrades Tracing and Initiatives** – (Attachment)
  - Presently funding everyone
  - Still taking applications
  - MDE has list of approved contractors
  - Victoria asked that SWQAC be notified of upcoming meetings on this topic

**News from DNR** – Sherm Garrison (*attachment*)

- **Power Plant Research Program (PPRP)** – Paul Petzrick
  - PPRP and Friends of Blackwater did a study of the Upper North Branch of the Potomac River
  - Interest was in the degradation of the River and results of different remediation efforts
  - The study produced a 96 page draft report
  - PPRP asking for SWQAC volunteers to review draft & provide comments by end of June
  - Volunteers included: Neil Jacobs, Sarah Taylor Rogers, Mat Pajeroski, Victoria Woodward, Dave Duree.
  
- **Algal bloom Update**
  - Fish kills have been reported in the news recently
  - Mid to late May scientists observed extensive blooms in middle of Chesapeake Bay, lower Magothy and Patuxent Rivers and Baltimore Harbor.

  - MDE and DNR teams will continue to track the situation and respond to reports of fish kills related to this bloom.
  
- **Deep Creek Lake Water Quality Monitoring Program**
  - Monitoring program began in April
  - Staff sampling monthly in mainstem and tributary coves of Deep Creek Lake
  - Website will be going up later this month with a lot of information
  
- **Tributary River Wade-Ins**
  - Some began last month
  - List of this month's included in report
  
- **Chesapeake Bay Program – Summer Water Quality Forecast**
  - Program will release its summer ecological forecast of dissolved oxygen and phytoplankton conditions next week.
  - Uses analyses of spring river flow patterns and pollutant loads to predict where harmful algae blooms and low oxygen “dead zones” may occur.
  - Once it is released, copies will be provided to SWQAC

- **Rebalancing' Chesapeake Bay Monitoring Activities**
  - A workshop was convened to develop a process that would result in the development of a plan to “re-align” the Chesapeake Bay monitoring effort to address new objectives of the Bay Program’s Management Board, which includes:
    - “Delisting of the Chesapeake Bay
    - Define management effectiveness in implementing nutrient and sediment control programs in the watershed.
  - Recommendations for proposed changes and a listing of concerns will be delivered by the teams to the Bay Program Management Board in October.
  - Implementation of a modified monitoring program would begin as early as January 2010.
  
- **Regulations**
  - List of regulation changes attached
  
- **Bay Stat**
  - Looking at redesigning the Governor’s Bay Stat website and to include all monitoring information

**News from SSA** – Adam Rettig

- **Use Attainability**
  - Putting together a workgroup
  
- **Tier II**
  - Workgroup to deal with issues identifying triggers that can be used in the regulatory process
  
- **Triennial Review**
  - Public hearing held
  - About 15 people attended
  - Lot of constructive comments
  - Day before hearing an informational conference call for those who could not attend hearing – 7 people attended - no comments or questions
  - Deadline for comments is June 17, 2009
  - On MDE website under Maryland Register
  
- **TMDLs**
  - Four documents up for public comments
  - Public comment closing date June 26, 2009
  
- **Fish Consumption Advisory**
  - Advisory to cover striped bass and bluefish caught through recreational fishing in Atlantic coastal waters
  - Advisories are based on a 2008 report by the Eastern Coastal Striped Bass and Bluefish Consumption Advisory Workgroup.
  - Workgroup evaluated methods used by states for developing consumption advisories regarding PCB in striped bass and bluefish from Maine to Georgia
  - MDE continually updates fish consumption advisories to reflect new data:
